It is with great sadness that we say good-bye to Keith Hatton '70 as a long-standing member of the ISB Network Board of Directors. During the past 10 years, his talents, time and skills have brought the Network into a new age. His knowledge of technology kept the Network moving forward. The improvements he made to our newsletter made reading it a pleasure. He helped to streamline the database and made it accessible for the rest of the board.

In late 1993 David Wilkerson had a lead on how to contact Keith, and wanted to talk to him about an idea he and John Dammon had been tossing around about reuniting some former Teen Club band members and possibly getting them to play at a reunion or two.

Soon after locating Keith, he and John got together and began jamming. Soon Terry Rogers and Kevin Farenholtz were contacted and all four, along with Babette Trout-Dammon and Keith's wife Peggy, started getting together on the weekends playing music and rehearsing.

During that time John and David (both already on the Board) had a discussion about offering Keith the newsletter editor job since he had a fully functioning printing press that he used for his church newsletter. Keith readily accepted the role as a Board member. His exact words were: "Sure I'll do it, is there anything else I can do?"

Over the next several years Keith produced a much-improved newsletter, often at his own expense. He was always available to help out with anything that needed to be done, even, occasionally helping Babette and John with database updates and mailings of postcards, newsletters and mailing lists.

"Keith is a team player. He was a blessing for so many reasons and in my

mind his only fault was he just did not know how to say NO," said David Wilkerson. "If you needed help with anything, anything at all, he would immediately step up and help. There is no telling how much of his personal money was used to produce the newsletter, postcards and mailing list. If we were low on money, and that was up until the 1998 Long Beach reunion, he would produce the newsletter at his own expense. I know the Board will miss his contributions greatly."

At the '94 Clearwater reunion John, Keith, Terry, Kevin, Babette and Peggy did their first Teen Club band performance. They provided the Saturday night entertainment at their own personal expense buying and renting instruments and sound gear, and transporting them to Florida so they could perform. Keith and the band were asked to perform again at the 1996 Dallas reunion. Again, at their own expense, they entertained us to the wee hours of the morning.

In 1998 John and Babette Trout-Dammon, along with Lynn Barringer, stepped down as long time Board members and Keith took over two roles that were being vacated; Treasurer and helping to transition Van Bucher as the then newly appointed newsletter editor.

In 1999 when the newsletter editor job became vacant, Keith once again pitched in doing double duty as newsletter editor and with database responsibilities for formatting the mailing list.

At the 2000 Williamsburg reunion Keith, along with the other band members and Mike Jepsen, performed again. This time the Board insisted that they receive payment but Keith declined to be paid as he felt it was a conflict of interest.

The following article is part of the presentation Marsha made at ISB to honor Jane Panamaneechot, this year's recipient of the ISB Network Cares Scholarship on April 4, 2003. (See accompanying story on page 4.)

The ISB Alumni Network Association started before the days of the Internet, instant messaging, e-mails and cell phones – when friends could only find each other by sending letters and making expensive long distance calls all over the world. Staying in touch was hard work back then. After our years at ISB, most of us went back to our home countries and found that we just couldn't recreate the camaraderie or the fun we had here in Thailand – there was something really special about the friendships we made here.

Remembering the parties we used to throw at our houses, or at little noodle shops down the back soi's in Bangkok, during the 1970s and 80s, our friends started digging through their address books, finding their old friends, inviting people to their homes or organizing Thai dinners – a few alumni at a time. We got to know each other again and it was like we never left.

Because Bangkok is so far away from many alumni, not everyone was as lucky as I was to attend the 50th ISB Reunion in Bangkok, so we had "spiritual reunions."

From those little backyard barbecues and mini-reunions at Thai restaurants all around the world, the ISB Network started to come together, one address and one phone number at a time. It took about 10 years for a few, very dedicated alumni, working with the ISB Alumni office, to find over 5,000 of our classmates – and we really celebrate when we find another one of our old friends that we were afraid we'd 'lost'.

In 2000, ISB generously granted the Network the honor of being the official U.S. 'sister' ISB Alumni Association, honoring all those volunteers who, over the past 18 years gave their time, energy, and love to building a true alumni Network – growing it from a few phone numbers to a bi-annual gathering of hundreds.

And we invite you to keep your contact information active in the network database. Both the school and the ISB Network Alumni Associations have websites. Stay in touch – the friends you make in school may be some of the best you'll ever have.

ISB Network Cares Scholarship Awarded to Jane Panamaneechot, Class of 2003

Because of ISB and the warm, friendly Thai people that remain in our hearts and minds, members of the ISB Network Alumni Association elected to dedicate a portion of the annual association dues to establish a scholarship fund, the ISB Network Cares Scholarship. The Network members decided that criteria would include being a Thai National or of Thai descent and be a deserving student as judged by teachers and counselors. On April 4, 2003, at the Songkhran and International Day Assembly, Jane Panamaneechot, an ISB student since 2nd grade, was awarded the ISB Network Cares Scholarship by ISB Class of 1969 Alumna, Marsha McCoskrie, a Bangkok resident from 1963-67 and from 1999 to present.

The ISB Network Alumni Association asked Alumni Office Director, Freda Williams, to request that ISB teachers and high school counselors select a graduating senior to receive the scholarship. They knew they had a challenge, says Dr. Jeffrey Harper, high school counselor. They drew up a list of ISB seniors who met that scholarship's criteria. They had to make a choice among a number of unique individuals, each with qualities that shined. In 2003, graduating senior, Jane Panamaneechot met the basic criteria and had qualities that, in this interviewer/writer's views, particularly reflect the future and an answer to 'the times'.

After speaking with Jane and with Mr. Roger Williams and Dr. Harper, Jane's 7th grade teacher and her high school counselor, respectively, it was obvious that key factors in Jane's successes were parents who listened to her ideas and interests and participated in her activities, challenging teachers, and her own determination.

Jane claims that she started to get serious about school in 6th grade, when math was her most difficult subject. Says Jane, "At first I thought math was just memorization and boring abstractions that didn't apply to life, but when my 6th grade teacher asked us to think about how it could be applied, I started asking questions after class." One day when Jane was confused and frustrated, Jane's teacher made the most of that encounter by explaining the underlying concepts "so I could do the problems on my own."

Jane figured out how to do HTML programming and build web sites on her own. While in high school, Jane also worked with her friends and fellow-students to raise money to buy internet appliances for nearby Thai high schools – and to give tutorials and teach those students how to use the internet and to develop an internet forum. This forum "gives students a chance to develop critical thinking skills, to discuss world issues, politics, war, or music, and to post comments on a message board."

One of the things Jane values about her education at ISB is the focus on critical thinking and teachers who teach by questioning to get students to think. When teachers show their own depth of interest and knowledge, when they make students feel comfortable to ask questions, and when they answer student's questions by asking challenging questions back, it causes thinking that extends out from the classroom discussions on underlying concepts to her informal time "hanging around with friends."

The ISB Network wishes Jane all the best wherever life takes her.
