ISB "TAHO" REUNION 1998

Wow, can you believe it. It's three and a half months until the 1998 ISB Reunion to be held August 14 - 16 at the Seaport Marina Hotel located in Long Beach, CA. Things are on track for this to be the biggest ISB reunion in the history of the ISB Network.

Theme

The ISB Network recently received an email from Kathy Stahlman '74 (printed elsewhere in this newsletter) describing what it was like to be too young to go to the Teen Club and how much she was looking forward to the upcoming reunion so that she could finally experience what she missed when she was in Bangkok. Marla Vincent '59 responded to Kathy's email by providing some early history about the Teen Club. It turns out that the original Teen Club was called T.A.H.O which stands for Teen Age Hang Out (location unknown. I'll try to find out for the next newsletter. Ed). It was moved in the mid '60s to Wireless Road, and finally to Soi Asoke (21) in the late 60's where it remained until it was shut down in the '80s. So, to all who were fortunate enough to "hang out" at the Teen Club, and to all who missed the opportunity for whatever the reason but would like to experience what it was like to "hang out", we are pleased to announce that the theme of this reunion will be TAHO '98.

When we announced the theme via email we received many positive responses. One of the emails was from Mrs. Donna Jacks who said: "... read your message regarding TAHO! I remember the "grand opening" with Marla in 1959. Before that, we used to hang out at the NAPA store (auto parts, can you believe it?) and drink COLD orange drinks. We waited with great anticipation for the TAHO, watching it take shape. I think I still have some original black and white photos of all of us there. I also have a copy of the ERAWAN yearbook from 1959 (Was it the first one? I'm not sure.) I'm really enjoying getting all the letters and info you've been forwarding. It has been almost 40 years and it seems like just yesterday. Thanks!".

Entertainment

First and foremost - the ISB Network reunion committee has been able to schedule **TWO** local bands to play at the reunion. "Snake Jacobs' Church of the Bearded Skeptics" (featuring ISBer Dan Ahlborn '76) will perform Friday night from 11pm until 1:30 am in "The 2nd Street Club" - a party room located in the hotel beside the lounge. This band performs original high-energy West Coast Groove, Funk and Rock music that everyone will enjoy! The entertainment for the dinner/dance Saturday night will be provided by "The Elm Street Band". This band has a repertiore of around 100 songs, covering music from the 50's through the 70's. Their strong suit is

vocal harmonies so they will be covering tunes by the Beach Boys, Beatles, Eagles and many other vocally strong bands. This band was voted the number two party band in the Southland next to "Sublime" who's original tunes we now hear constantly on the radio. What this means is that "The Elm Street Band" is PRETTY DARN GOOD!!!

Hotel and Hotel Reservation Information

Seaport Marina Hotel is located on Pacific Coast Highway at 2nd Street. It borders the Marina and is close to two shopping centers, 19 restaurants including a very good Thai restaurant (according to Dave Wilkerson), movie theaters, Disneyland, Catalina Island, Knott's Berry Farm Hollywood, the Queen Mary, and three great beaches. We have been given an outstanding rate of \$69/night by the hotel. This rate is good from August 10 through August 20 for those who want to arrive before and/or stay after the reunion. The ISB Network has a guaranteed block of 175 rooms out of 249. The block will be reviewed on June 17, and again three weeks prior to the reunion. Contact the hotel at (800) 434-8451, or visit their web site at http://www.seaportmarinahotel.com to make your reservations. Mention that you will be attending the ISB NETWORK REUNION. MAKE YOUR HOTEL RESERVATIONS NOW EVEN IF YOU'RE NOT SURE YOU WILL BE ATTENDING! This will help us guarantee our block. If you find you cannot make it, your reservations can be cancelled up to 48 hours in advance. We currently have more than 60 rooms reserved, which equates to approximately 100 people!! "This far out ... this is going to be A WAY HUGE REUNION" Dave Wilkerson said in a recent email. The more rooms booked in advance, the more accomodating the hotel will be . . . letting us take over the courtyard in the center of the hotel, and/or the pool, etc.

Seaport Marina Hotel will be doing the catering and providing us with two party rooms - the Marina Room and the 2nd Street Club. The Marina room, located on the second floor of the hotel, will be the main ISB hangout. It has a dance floor, a balcony overlooking the marina, facilities to hang out (tables/chairs), and a cash bar that will remain open until 1:30am. It will also be our registration post and house the ISB archives.

Reunion Registration Information

The reunion registration fee is \$85 for alumni and \$75 for spouses and guests. Children under the age of six are free. **The Reunion registration fee is in addition to your hotel reservations**. Registration entitles each person to attend all the Friday through Sunday events listed on page two. In addition, alumni will receive an Alumni Reunion Package and other items. If you are not able to attend an event the prorated fees are: Friday Cocktail Party - \$30/

person; Saturday Dinner/Dance - \$45/person. Note which event you and/or your guests are not going to attend on your reunion registration form.

PLEASE SEND IN THE REGISTRATION FORM AS EARLY AS YOU CAN! This will help things run smoother by allowing us to complete as much as possible before the reunion. There will be a late fee of \$15.00 after August 1, 1998. We accept Visa, MasterCard, and American Express, or you can pay by check or money order made payable to ISB Network, Inc.

Child Care

Carol Cole Shenenberger's ('72) teenage daughter Emily and a couple of friends have volunteered to watch children at the hotel. The hotel will provide the rooms for this. Emily will coordinate child care. The fee is \$6.00 per hour and you are expected to pay her directly. We are confident that Emily and her friends will do a great job, however, The Seaport Marina Hotel, The ISB Network, and the Shenenberger family will assume NO liability for your children. If you so desire, you can contact the hotel for the numbers of licensed child care facilities in the Long Beach area.

Travel Arrangements

Travel arrangements couldn't be easier with three airports within 45 minutes of the hotel. Long Beach Airport is the closest being 10-15 minutes away. Seaport Marina Hotel offers free shuttle bus service to and from this airport. Los Angeles International and Orange County Airports are good alternatives. Both are 30-45 minutes away from the hotel (depending on traffic) with super shuttle available for \$30/person round trip.

Two ISB Alumni wait ready and willing to help with travel arrangements with ALL carriers. Dee Medlin James '70 with Aloha Travel has cut a deal with American Airlines (the primary server for Long Beach Airport) where a 10% discount is offered for ISB'ers who call to make travel arrangements for the reunion before June 1, 1998 to any of the Los Angeles area airports. Bookings to the reunion after this date receive a 5% discount. Dee can be reached at (800) 327-8867.

In addition, Maile McCoskrie Busby '67 informs us that, as part of a special promotion, America West Airlines is offering 10% off the lowest available fare for tickets booked in advance for flights into the Los Angeles area and zone fares for those who can't decide until the last moment. Maile has also offered to assist with ground transportation from the three major area airports by prescheduling Southern California Coach to meet arriving ISB'ers and take them to the Sea Port Marina Hotel. Call Maile at home (714) 673-4632 or the office (800) 714-2359 for a fare quote or, if you're interested in ground transportation, give her your flight schedule and she will group ISB Reunion attendees together to maximize coach savings.

We lived in Bangkok from the summer of '71 to the summer of '73, for our Freshman & Sophomore years at ISB. Marian and I (usually along with the gang of ISBers from Soi 24 Bangkok Court) would pile eagerly into Taxi's and Samlars and get away to a place with no parents—the Teen Club. I would love nothing more than to reminisce at TAHO '98 with some of the old "gang": Missy & Melanie Mathis, Lorraine & Joel Zamora, Tim Todd, Randy & Jim Perritt, Claudia Waidelich, Cindy McQuerry, Rebecca & Marilyn Kay, Jim & Jeff Gohagan.
