ISB Reunion 2000

In only 10 short months the ISB Network will be hosting its first reunion of the Millennium! What a better place to reunite than in Williamsburg, Virginia at a landmark hotel situated on a historic battlefield. For nearly three hundred years, people have gathered in Williamsburg to share ideas, resolve conflict, and celebrate triumph.

The reunion will be held August 4 - 6, 2000 at the Radisson Fort Magruder Hotel and Conference Center. The hotel is located 1 mile from Colonial Williamsburg. A few blocks away you will find Busch Gardens Williamsburg, a 17th Century European-style theme park. Other nearby areas of interest are Water Country USA, award-winning golf on several challenging courses and nature lovers can tour by bike or foot on extensive, easy, winding trails.

Budgeting for and attending ISB reunions every two years has become a way of life for a large number of us these past years. For those of you new to the network, the reunion committee offers these cost saving recommendations for budgeting this memorable event. If you're traveling alone, share a room with a few of your fellow classmates. Visit our web site regularly for the latest update on alumni registrations. Buy your airline tickets EARLY! Check out prices on the Internet. Find out what the arrival/departure times are of other alumni and share the ride to/from the airport, or split the cost of a rental car.

Hotel and Hotel Reservation Information

Hotel rate is \$89/night and is good from Wednesday, August 2 - 6, 2000. We have blocked 200 rooms in anticipation of the largest reunion to date. Each individual will be responsible for making their own reservations by calling the hotel at 1-800-333-3333.

Suites are available on a first come first serve basis for those of you interested in reserving one rather than a standard room. Rates for a Junior Suite (2 double beds & pull out bed, kitchenette) are \$199/night. Rates for Executive suites (2 double beds and a pull-out king size bed, large living room and kitchenette) are \$250/night.

All reservations must be made by July 1, 2000, at which time any rooms not reserved will be released for public sale. The hotel will be sold out that weekend between our room block and the room blocks reserved for the two other groups booked for that weekend. Anyone attempting to make hotel reservations AFTER July 1, 2000 will be booked at the overflow hotel, Quarter Pass Inn, which is located next door to the Radisson.

All reservations must be guaranteed. A deposit equivalent to one night's room and tax or by a major credit card is required, The hotel must be notified 48 hours prior to arrival to avoid a no-show fee of one night's room and tax being charged. Guest check-in time is 4:00 PM to ensure that the room is clean upon your arrival. Check-out time is 11:00 AM.

With prior notice, the hotel will be happy to provide any attraction tickets and can put together a package plan for multiple attractions.

There will be two hospitality rooms at the hotel. The Kearny Room will be open Friday & Saturday from 10:00 AM - 6:00 PM. The Shack merchandise will be on display and sold from this room. We will also have our Thailand memorabilia, year-books and videos set up in the Kearny Room. Class Reps will be on hand to meet and greet the newcomers and answer any ISB related questions. Refreshments will also be provided in the Kearny Room.

Friday and Saturday afternoons and evenings we will have a hospitality suite available as another gathering spot. This tends to be the "hot" spot after the official activities are over and the bar has closed down.

The hotel has an indoor and outdoor swimming pool. Hours are 7:00 AM - 11:00 PM daily. However, the hotel has made special arrangements to extend the pools hours for our exclusive use between the hours of 11:00 PM and 1:00 AM. No other hotel guests will be permitted to use the pools during these hours.

Other hotel accommodations include hot tub, sauna and exercise room, lighted outdoor tennis courts, restaurant, sports bar/lounge, game room (for the children).

Entertainment

The ISB alumnus band has agreed to provide live music for the customary Saturday evening dinner/dance. Apart from a few (Continued on page 2)

favorites that must go along with any reunion dance, the band will feature a new expanded repertoire. This band is comprised of ISB Alumni who used to play at the Teen Clubs in Bangkok, and they are ready to take you back to relive the experience of those Saturday night dances many years ago.

Reunion Registration Information

The reunion registration fee is in addition to your hotel reservation rate. The reunion registration fee is \$100 for alumni and \$90 for spouses and guests. Children under the age of six are free. Registration entitles each person to attend all the Friday through Sunday events listed on page 3. In addition, alumni will receive an Alumni Package and other items.

PLEASE SEND IN THE REUNION REGISTRATION FORM AS EARLY AS YOU CAN! This will help the reunion committee members plan in advance many of the details that go on behind the scenes, e.g. accurate counts for badges, Alumni packages, Shack merchandise, food and beverage requirements.

There will be a late fee of \$20.00 after July 1, 2000. We accept Visa, MasterCard, American Express, personal check or money order made payable to ISB Network, Inc. Your name will be posted on our web site when you send us your registration fees. ISB Network History 1983-1999

It all started for me in 1982 when fellow classmates from the class of 1973 began writing one another to try to organize a 10 year reunion for us in 1983. At the time, I was living in the United Kingdom. Although we had a mailing list given to us before graduation, it was 10 years old and many of the addresses were now non-existent. We did have our 10 year reunion, thanks to Carroll Smeltzer and a few others who helped organize it in Denver in 1983. Upon my return to the states in August 1983, I promised myself I would not let anymore time slip away without trying to find my fellow classmates and organize another reunion. Joe Condrill, '73 had the same vision and we started with our list given to us from ISB of 141 addresses and lists from fellow classmates we were in touch with.

Within 6 months classmates sent us lists from two previous reunions, one held for the class of 1971 in Denver in 1981, organized by Bob Athearn and Tony Rickard, and one held in Washington DC in the 70's for the classes of '67,'68, and '69 (list provided by the Doggetts). We used those lists to attempt to find our classmates. As we began contacting people on the lists they wanted to be included in our mailings even though they weren't in our class. By May of 1984 our list had grown to about 300 names mostly from the classes of '71-'75. We decided to organize a reunion for August of 1984 and so the ISB Network was born.

Atlanta 1984- August 10-12, Atlanta Airport Hilton Inn; 125 people. During the business meeting plans were made to form an alumni group (mainly the '70s) for all associated with ISB, publish news-

letters, mailing list, biography book, and hold a second reunion in two years.

<u>San Diego 1986</u>- August 15-17, Holiday Inn; 213 people. The mailing list had grown to over a thousand. The alumni group included the '60s.

<u>Boston 1988</u>- August 5-7, Marriott Cambridge;180 people. <u>San Antonio 1990</u>- August 10-12, Fountain Plaza Hotel; 300 people.

<u>Seattle 1992</u>- July 30- August 2, Airport Red Lion; 165 people. <u>Clearwater 1994</u>- August 4-7, Sheraton Sand Key Resort; 200 people. Gil Hair '60 provided lists from mini reunions he organized in '61, '63, and '83 for the classes of 1958, '59, and'60 in Washington DC.

<u>Dallas 1996</u>- July 25-28, Harvey Hotel Addison; 150 people. <u>Long Beach 1998</u>-August 7-9, Sea Port Marina Hotel, 345 people. The following people played major roles in helping incorporate the ISB Network and kept it running: Sarah Lynn Barringer '68, John Dammon '69, Babette Trout Dammon '72, Jim Hanlon '73, Joe Condrill '73, Robert Bridges '70, Jed Davis '70, Dave Wilkerson '71, Keith Hatton '70, Faith Mercuro '75.

Debbi Dietrich '73, Paul Fuelling '73, John Bankhead '73, Barb Johnson '73, Tony Grady '73, Sara Noss '73, Pam Alexander '74, Debbie Hollier '74, Diane Darling '76, Kate Johnson '76, Donna Alexander '76, Alex Aakesson '76, John Aakesson '78, the entire Ewing family, and faculty members Paul Rashap, Nancy Sime, and Larry Sime.

The ISB Network is one of 240 active or inactive alumni groups representing 178 overseas schools located in 56 countries around the world. In comparison to other overseas alumni groups, the ISB Network has held more major reunions than most. The ISB Network actively cooperates with these groups, offering help, friendship, and the coordination of activities. Officers and members of the ISB Network have participated in the OVERSEAS BRATS "gatherings", the annual national convention for all those associated with overseas schools, as course presenters and

exhibitors since 1991. One of the founders of the ISB Network, Joe Condrill '73 is also the founder and president of OVER-SEAS BRATS.

Today, the ISB Network is a successful, incorporated, not-forprofit organization with over 345 paying members and an active board comprised of ISB alumni. Through the diligence of the board, the class representatives and others mentioned above, the number of ISB alumni on our database has grown to 3780.

The ISB Network would not be in existence today or have survived for 17 years without the loyalty, work, and time that each member has put into the Network. Every person who mentions, writes, or calls someone plays an integral part in the Network.

Vietnam Trilogy

In 1958, when I was 13 years old, I accompanied my mother to Saigon. She was a Foreign Service Officer with the US State Department. From 1951 to 1956 I lived with her in India on another assignment, so I was prepared to make further adjustments to yet another culture, another language, another school, another set of friends. After the chaos and color of India, I was not prepared for the relative serenity and European flavor of Saigon's tree-lined boulevards. The French left behind not only their lilting language, but a flair for creating a visually enchanting downtown. Until the American Embassy was able to find us a house, we stayed for several weeks at a quayside hotel overlooking the Saigon River. Plans were made for me to begin 9th Grade at the Embassy Correspondence School, not-so-charmingly located in a Quonset hut near town.

Life was easy for this typical teenager during the six months we lived in Vietnam. I swam at the Sports Club, scootered around town on a friend's moped, did my homework, and cavorted in the South China Sea, which lapped against beautiful beaches to the north. Little was I aware of the political unrest roiling beneath the calm surface of my world in Vietnam. As we left Tan Son Nhut Airport for four years in Bangkok, Thailand, President Diem was about to be overthrown and this beautiful country of peaceful people was at the brink of a plunge into a terrible war.



In the fall of 1962, I returned to the US to attend college, after graduating from the International School in Bangkok. Although I attended a very small, liberal college in Vermont, after so many years abroad I felt very much like an outsider. My roots in Asia were strong and my empathy for its countrymen was unswerving. After all, my childhood was essentially molded by the customs, culture and people of Far Eastern lands. When the war in Vietnam invaded the consciences of many of my college friends, I joined them in a stand against the killing and we traveled to the March on the Pentagon in Washington DC. My sister, attending a Quaker boarding school in Pennsylvania, met us there. And we marched - thousands and thousands of us from the Lincoln Memorial across the Potomac to the Pentagon, which was ringed with hundreds of armed troops. We went peaceably, and placed flowers in their rifle barrels. My sister was separated from us, and the next morning she called from a Virginia jail requesting that we post bail. She told us she was unceremoniously dragged by her hair to a police van and later shared a cell with Joan Baez, joyfully singing anti-war songs through the night. We were almost envious.

In the early 80's I visited a dear friend in Virginia who shared my high school days in Bangkok (Gail Loudermilk Kirk '61). She was a close assistant to Robert Kennedy in Washington, and in the course of her work after his death, took many visitors to see the Vietnam Memorial. Although I only had a few days with her, she insisted I visit The Wall. She told me that every time she went, she wept. I wondered if I would also weep. After all, this was a war I detested and protested.

I weep now, as I did then. Walking closer and closer to those black slabs and seeing names - so many names - I was overwhelmed with sadness at the loss of brave, young men who fell and died so far away. Still, a part of me has to wonder: What if there were also a wall in Vietnam inscribed with the names of so many Vietnamese loved ones gone?
