I attended ISB from 1988 to 1994. When I first arrived at ISB as an awkward, pudgy 7th grader, I thought I was going to be in Bangkok for two years. My parents' tour with the US Embassy quickly extended to four years. Then the tour grew to six years. After a brief adjustment period, I soon became quite comfortable at ISB.

At age 17, I moved back to the States to go to college in North Carolina. I spent time at both North Carolina State University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. At neither of these questionably fine institutions did I find the quality of education I experienced at ISB. All of the teachers at ISB more than prepared me for anything I ran into at college.

Four years and an advertising degree later, I acquired a rather cynical impression of higher education in the States. The more time I spent in the States, the more I wanted to return to Bangkok.

This past summer, I started preparing for my move back to Bangkok. I worked two jobs, played bass in a punk rock band, and crashed on friends' couches. I saved money, and started searching for contacts that would help me find a job in Bangkok.

During my search, I stumbled upon a web site for the ISB Network. I had never heard of the organization, but I quickly became interested. I discovered that the ISB Network gathered every two years for a reunion of all ISB alumni. I found out that in August the ISB reunion was going to be held in Long Beach, California. Upon learning this, I routed my travel plans so I would be able to attend the 1998 ISB Reunion.

The ISB Reunion was, by every definition, a fabulous event. I hadn't a clue what to expect. I realized that it was a collection of some of the most interesting people in the world. Amazing people who all shared the same alma mater. I met ISBers from decades before. I was by far the youngest attendee. I was the only alum who

Williamsburg Update

It's official! We will be smashing all the ISB Network reunion attendance records at the R2K Reunion in Williamsburg, VA. As of June 16, 2000 we have 250 rooms booked between the Radisson Fort Magruder Hotel and the overflow hotel, for an approximate total count of 400 people attending the reunion. We can't provide accurate numbers right now because many of you who have booked a hotel room have not registered for the reunion, and vice-versa. We still have six more weeks to go, folks!

If you are planning on attending the reunion and have not made your hotel reservation, do so now by contacting Cathy Patton, Reservations Manager at the Radisson, at (757) 220-2250 or email her at **cathypatton@earthlink.net** and she will assign you to the overflow hotel. Do not try to call the toll free number listed on our web site and on our registration form(s) to make your hotel reservation. You will be told the hotel is sold out! THE FOLLOWING IS VERY IMPORTANT: if for some reason you cannot make the reunion and have made a hotel reservation, or are holding an extra room and don't need it, please make sure you release your room(s) by contacting Cathy Patton. She will make sure that an ISB Reunion attendee in overflow gets it at the \$89/night rate on a first come first serve basis.

Many of you who have booked rooms have not sent your registration form in with your payment yet. Any registrations postmarked after July 1, 2000, or faxed in after that date need to include a late charge of \$20.00/person. This includes spouses, guests and/or children. We need to submit a final tally for catering on July 1, and this is what the hotel will charge us for additional headcount after that date. If the late fee is not included on registrations received after July 1, you will be required to pay it when you sign in for the reunion at the hotel.

If you are signed up as an alumni or faculty member for the reunion you will receive a reunion t-shirt as part of your package. This only applies to those of you that paid the full \$100.00 registration fee and does not apply to spouses, guests or children.



THE ELEPHANT QUEEN

A New Novel About Thailand by Paul Soderberg '67

"In The Elephant Queen, the twenty-something founder of a San Antonio women's shelter collides with the man who rules Bangkok's sex scene. The first novel of ISBer Paul Soderberg ('67), The Elephant Queen is an Internet novel, available only at www.1stBooks.com (\$4.95).

"Alumni from the 60s might remember Paul as "the Snake Guy" (his 8,000+ preserved specimens became the core herpetology collection of the Thai National Museum), his three brothers (Dave, John, and Steve), and their mother, Betty Soderberg, who taught 4th Grade at ISB from 1960 to 1968.

"Paul's interest in the Thai jungle, where much of the novel is set, was inspired in part by Phil Reeves and Mrs. Woodbury. In college (Arizona State, cultural anthropology), as a Peace Corps Volunteer (Afghanistan, famine relief), and as an investigative reporter (for a series of articles exposing the abuse of minority children in Arizona public schools he was named 1990 National Newsperson of the Year by the largest and oldest Hispanic organization in America), he studied people with the same intensity and objectivity with which he'd studied Thai snakes. The result of both interests - wild animals, and the wild animals inside people - is this remarkable novel that exposes and slams child prostitution in the world's Sex Sin Central, Bangkok.

"There is a warning on the novel's publication page that while this is a love story - of love that never dies versus undying hatred - it contains descriptions of sex and violence that may be disturbing to readers. As the novel's very first reader, Paul's "critique reader," I can tell you with authority that that warning should definitely be heeded by those of delicate sensibilities. The reason is that those disturbing scenes are rendered with exceptional power. In point of fact, the entire novel is written that way - in such a way that you, the reader, feel like you're actually in the scene

"While the novel comes with the warning noted, it should also come with this six-part guarantee: after reading The Elephant Queen, you will never again be able to see a butterfly as simply a lovely flying insect; you will be absolutely enchanted by elephants; you will want to hop the first thing that smokes nonstop to Thailand, to see, or revisit, the incredible Land of Smiles; if you now hold the view that prostitution is a victimless crime, you will abandon that view and forevermore see it for what it really is; you will believe in your heart that although Bangkok has sunk so deeply in a sea of smut, there is hope after all for the "City of Angels" in "the Land of the Free"; and you will be very eager to see any fiction written by anyone who ever learned how to write at the International School, Bangkok."
